

Statement on Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) and Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

It is our mission to continually and systematically improve our products, manufacturing and business practices to assure the safety of our employees, the public, and the environment. As such, we are constantly monitoring the various worldwide regulations and directives that apply to our business, and we comply where required by law and by our own sense of social responsibility.

The Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) was enacted in 1976 to prevent unreasonable risk of injury to human health or the environment associated with the manufacture, processing, importing, use and disposal of chemical substances. On June 22, 2016, the Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act updated the TSCA. This act provides the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) with authority to require reporting, recordkeeping and testing requirements, and restrictions relating to chemical substances and/or mixtures.

On January 6, 2021, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) published its final rules under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) Section 6(h) to restrict the importation and use of five persistent, bioaccumulative, and toxic (PBT) chemicals:

Decabromodiphenyl Ether (DecaBDE)
Hexachlorobutadiene (HCBD)
Phenol, Isopropylated Phosphate (3:1) (PIP 3:1)
Pentachlorothiophenol (PCTP)
2,4,6-tris(tert-butyl)phenol (2,4,6-TTBP)

In November of 2023, the EPA finalized a rule that will require all domestic entities, and importers of products to the United States, to report the use of any PFAS substances (Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances) in products or manufacturing processes dating back to 2011. Moore Industries-International, Inc. products do not contain any PFAS substances, and the company does not use any PFAS substances in its manufacturing processes.

Furthermore, Moore Industries-International, Inc. has reviewed, and continually reviews, the TSCA listed substances and as of this date does not sell, distribute, procure, produce, or manufacture products that contain any of the prohibited chemical substances on this list.

Moore Industries-International, Inc. will maintain communication with our suppliers and continuously review the EPA's evolving list of toxic substances and will update our compliance statements, records, and documents accordingly.
