

Statement on RoHS and WEEE European Environmental Protection Directives (EU) 2015/863 and 2012/19/EU

It is our mission to continually and systematically improve our products, manufacturing and business practices to assure the safety of our employees, the public and the environment. As such, we are constantly monitoring the various worldwide regulations and directives that apply to our business, and we comply where required by law and our own sense of social responsibility.

RoHS (Restriction of Hazardous Substances)

RoHS Directives restricts the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment. Directive (EU) 2015/683, recast as RoHS 3, was published in the Official Journal of the European Union on June 4, 2015 and became effective on July 22, 2019. Directive 2015/683/EC is an amendment to Annex II of Directive 2011/65/EU (RoHS 2) adding four additional restricted substances to the existing six.

Moore Industries-International, Inc. is a supplier of industrial process instrumentation which falls within Category 9, Industrial Monitoring and Control Instruments per scope of coverage in Annex 1 of Directive 2011/65/EU. Moore Industries-International, Inc. is committed to meeting directive provisions and is taking a proactive approach to new product design, manufacturing and procurement processes. None of the 10 restricted substances under (EU) 2015/683 are present in our products in a quantity above the maximum concentration value (0.1% w/w, .01% w/w for cadmium).

Moore Industries-International, Inc. manufactures a variety of products that conform to RoHS Directives. To assist in selecting compliant products, status may be checked on the company website per RoHS Directives (EU) 2015/863/EU List of Compliant Products.

WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment)

The recast WEEE Directive 2012/19/EU was published in the Official Journal of the European Union on July 24, 2012 and is already in effect. The directive specifies its scope of coverage in Annex III, Categories 1-6 and now applies to all electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) including industrial monitoring and control instruments.

As a matter of practicality, end of life disposal of our products must be managed by industrial customers or system integrators because our products are an integral part of factory or industrial process installations.
