

Statement on California Proposition 65

As such, we are constantly monitoring the various worldwide regulations and directives that apply to our business, and we comply where required by law and our own sense of social responsibility.

Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986

Prop 65, officially known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, became law in November 1986. The proposition protects the state's drinking water sources from being contaminated with chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm, and requires businesses to inform Californians about exposures to such chemicals.

Businesses are required to provide warnings of their products with significant exposures to chemicals regulated on the Prop 65 chemical list determined by the Office of Environment Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA).

Moore Industries is a supplier of industrial process instrumentation and is committed to providing quality and safe products to all of our customers. Moore Industries with the support of 3rd party health and safety services has reviewed and assessed the impact of the listed chemicals on our products. It has been determined products manufactured by Moore Industries do not contain chemicals regulated by Prop 65 in concentrations resulting in exposures above the safe harbor levels. Therefore, in accordance with the Act our products do not require Prop 65 labeling.

Moore Industries will continue to monitor our compliance to the listed Prop 65 chemicals. If it is determined any of our products are required to contain the Prop 65 warning label, they will be labeled in accordance with all subject laws and regulations. Note that such warning does not imply the product is unsafe, but rather is provided to allow the consumer to make informed decisions regarding their purchase and their exposure to the referenced Prop 65 chemicals.
