As a manufacturer of high-quality industrial instrumentation products, we do not directly source any raw materials from the continent of Africa, but we do use many components from different suppliers. Moore Industries is fully aware of the full provisions of section 1502 relating to conflict materials. As such we continually work with all of our suppliers to ensure that no materials we purchase from them contain material that was sourced or originated from the Democratic Republic of Congo or adjoining countries, as defined in Section 1502(e)(1), due to environmental, wildlife or humanitarian concerns.

We have received correspondence from our key suppliers that state their active efforts in working with their suppliers to maintain open communication and compliance with HR 4173, Section 1502. Furthermore, we and our key suppliers support the position of the RBA (Responsible Business Alliance), a comprehensive code of conduct that addresses all aspects of corporate responsibility.

Moore Industries continues to work with our electronic component distributors and suppliers on compliance with the above regulation and amendments.
